# E-books from Ebsco

Ebsco covers over 5,000 academic journals, but also has a collection of e-books that you will find really useful. You can read these on your screen at home as well as at INTO.

## A) Using *Ebsco E-Books*

- i) You can access **Ebsco E-Books** via the Learning Centre webpage at <http://intolearningcentre.co.uk/online-resources/>
- ii) click on the **Open Athens** logo
- iii) Use your **Open Athens Username** and **Password** to log in. ***If you do not have a username or password, come into the Learning Centre and get them!***
- iv) You will see the following screen. Put in your search term and press **Search**

Once you have your results, on the left-hand side of the screen, you can limit your search to the E-Book collection. Select **eBooks** only.

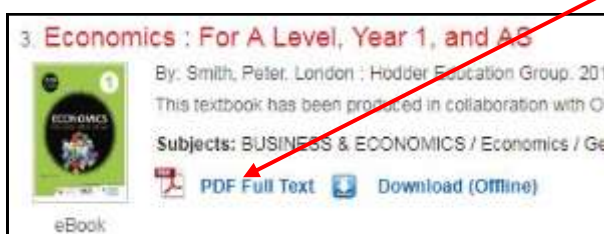
You can also limit by publication date by moving the handles on the date bar.

This will help you find the most recent information

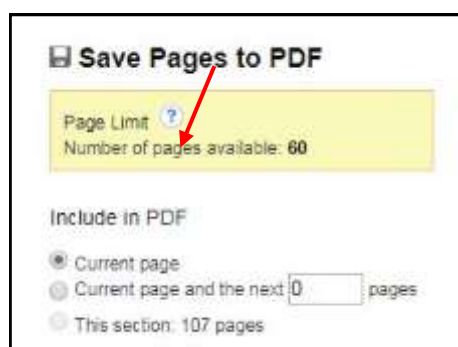
**Note: if you are looking for a particular book/ a specific title, change the search box from keyword to title and put the name of the book in the search box.**

You can also search by **author**, by changing the search box to **author**

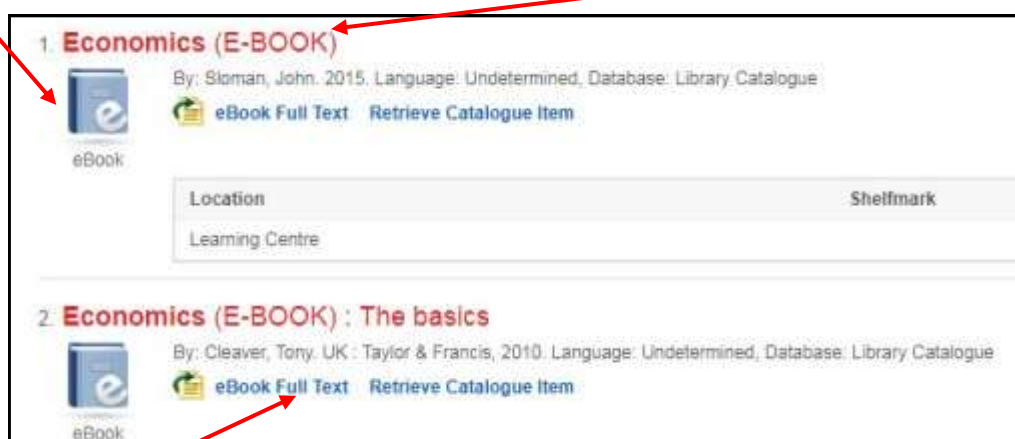
When you see a book you are interested in reading, click on **PDF Full Text** to open



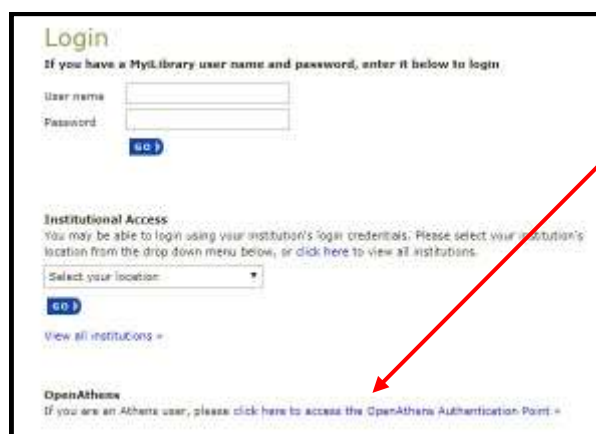
You are able to **Save Pages to PDF** or **Print Pages to PDF**. You will be told how many pages you can save/print as this will vary from book to book according to copyright law.



Sometimes you will find items that do not have a PDF but have a note **E-Book** by the title and a picture rather than the cover of the actual book



Click **eBook Full Text** and the following screen appears. **Do NOT** log in but click at the bottom where it reads "OpenAthens If you are an Athens user, please [click here to access the OpenAthens Authentication Point](#)" This will then open an online version of the book.



**Other Electronic books** E-books may also be found via the databases *EBook Central* and *ISSUES Online*; there are guides to help use these services.
